Qasmi Delivers Hyderi Memorial Lecture

Jammu & Kashmir Academy of Art, Culture & Languages (JKAACL) Saturday organised a memorial lecture on the present status of Urdu research. The function was presided over by well known Urdu critic and former Vice Chancellor, Kashmir University, Prof. Hamidi Kashmiri while Chief Information Commissioner, GR Sufi attended it as chief guest. Head Department of Urdu, Kashmir University Prof. Majeed Muzmir was the guest of honour.

In his presidential remarks, Prof. Hamidi lauded the Academy for organising the lecture and said that such a thing was needed to highlight the remarkable contribution of Prof. Hyderi to Urdu language and literature. He appreciated the Secretary Academy for making the institution a hub of literary activities. Describing Prof. Hyderi as a doyen of Urdu language and literature GR Sufi said that writings of the late scholar and writer were of high calibre and needed to be highlighted.
